

Bumrungrad International Hospital

As of 1 July 2020, the Bumrungrad Mobile Clinic recommenced, heading out to the various communities in Bangkok to provide their healthcare services. They began with 10 of the 25 usual communities in Bangkok that normally receive assistance; however, now with new protocols and regulations set in place to adapt to the New Normal. These safety measures and protocols as part of the New Normal include requiring all patients and medical staff to wash their hands and use alcohol-based hand sanitizers. Patients must also get their temperatures checked prior to seeing the doctor. As well, chairs are placed apart to maintain social distancing and acrylic dividers are placed between patients and doctors during the screening. Doctors and medical staff are required to wear Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), such as face masks and gloves at all times to prevent the spread of germs.

One of the first communities the Mobile Clinic selected during the New Normal, as a test run for the new protocols, was the Baan Don community, which consisted of 54 patients in total — 2 children, 24 adults, and 28 older adults.

Working under these conditions may seem to be less convenient than before, and staff may have to work a bit harder, but these requirements, these new regulations and safety measures, are essential in maintaining a safe environment for the well-being of everyone.
